Through our intentional acts of caring and justice, we are witnessing to others our obedience to, and love of, God – showing our neighbors in a very visible way that we value what God gave us, that we are willing to take care of it, and that we will work to assure that the Lord's bounty is shared with everyone!"



Here are a few suggestions to help us express our gratitude for God's good creation and our desire to care for it.

- Commit to using reusable shopping bags rather than plastic.
- Examine your grocery list and buy foods that will be used not tossed. Eat your leftovers and bring home restaurant uneaten restaurant meals.
- Wash laundry using cold water and wait for a full load.
- Ignore the commercials and wait for a full load in the dishwasher as well. Also, turn off the heated dry then open the door to air dry dishes.
- Remember to Reduce, Reuse, Recycle!


#### Food Drive during General Conference




